

Unit One Overview

Unit One Learning Goal: The student will be able to identify and describe significant physical and human features in the state of Oklahoma.

Unit One Formative Assessment 1: Students will correctly identify each of the 10 regions of Oklahoma on the map provided

Unit One Formative Assessment 2: Students will be able to accurately place major physical and human features in each area (approximately 30 total features- 20 Ms. Argo chooses, 10 you choose).

Unit One Formative Assessment 3: Students will “research” an Oklahoma college or university assigned to them. The students will gather relevant information about the college/university and answer the question, “Why Oklahoma for college?” in regards to his or her college/university researched. Students will also create a pennant to place on a class map of Oklahoma.

Unit One Summative Assessment: Map of Oklahoma. Part one- you are responsible for knowing the 10 regions and be able to place them correctly on the map. Part two- You will also be asked to accurately place 20 significant features/places given by Ms. Argo and 10 more determined by you. Part three- You will need to explain why 10 features/places are significant to Oklahoma (and justify why you chose them)!
